Tillington Manor Primary School – Sport Premium Action Plan and Evaluation 2023-2024

Overview

There has been an incredible change within Sporting provision across Tillington Manor. This has seen staff gain valuable training and the children being able to access and use new and improved equipment, some of which had not been replaced for many years. The additional money received has allowed us to restock our P.E. store and has given staff the ability to teach a much enriched sporting curriculum – staff now have access to brand new equipment for all major sports, allowing for quality first teaching to occur in all lessons.

We are continuing to develop sport within our school and our aim, which we have recently achieved, was to secure permanent physical equipment to support children in KS1 and children with SEND. Through these initiatives we will encourage all children to be actively involved in sport at Tillington Manor.

PE Passport	£700	To improve the assessment of PE within school, PE passport allows teachers to record judgements on the system within the lesson and use AFL to adjust subsequent lessons. PE passport also gives us access to over 500 videos to model skills and show the children how to perform said skill. The system will also provide teachers with a range of lesson plans that they can access.	Pupils have had a broad, balanced and high quality curriculum. This has led to more children becoming genuinely physically literate with transferable skills. The emphasis on intra school competition in the PE Passport has enabled children to apply those skills they have been taught and experience those very important skills of winning and losing; alongside developing a sporting attitude.
