Communication with staff in school

As we continue to navigate the current academic year, we would like to remind you of our communication policy regarding teacher availability. Our teachers are available for communication from 8.30am to 4pm during weekdays. We understand that communication between teachers and parents is important, and we strive to make this process as convenient as possible for all with our school use of ClassDojo. A reminder that during the school day, teachers' focus is on their class and they do not always pick messages up until after 3.15pm. If you have urgent messages during the day, please contact the school office.

Please can we remind you that communication should be mutually respectful, and that there will be no tolerating rude or abusive communications. We strive to work in partnership with parents and carers as this is paramount to the successful education of your child. We operate a 48 hours return contact for any of our school staff.

General School reminders

Pupils should not be on school site before 8.30am unless attending Clubhouse/Bee Active morning club.

Pupils from EYFS up to Year 4 should not be left on school grounds unsupervised at any time. Pupils in Year 5 and 6 are permitted to walk to and from school with parental permissions, however any pupils who show cause for concern will have this right removed for their own safety.

Please can I politely remind all parents and carers that vaping and smoking is not permitted on school grounds.

Dogs are also not permilted on school grounds, including waiting inside the first set of gates.

Please think carefully about parking on Young Avenue as this can impact pupils safely.

Please remind pupils to get off bikes or scooters before entering the school gates - there have been some high speed near misses this week and we would hate for any accidents to happen.

We operate a healthy schools policy but have recently seen a lot of big bars of chocolate and share bags of crisps being brought as a snack for breaktime. We have also seen lunch boxes filled with large quantities of sugary food. A treat is all part of a balanced diet, but excessive amounts of sugary foods will be removed, in line with policy.

Whilst your child is waiting to enter and exit school, they should be supervised by you at all times. For their safety, please do not let them enter the carpark areas, climb trees or run and hide in the foliage on school grounds.

Attendance and Punctuality

Regular altendance and arriving to school on time is extremely contributes to their performance in school.

If your child is unable to attend school, please inform the school office by 8.30am. It is important these messages go directly to the school office <u>via the new phone system, NOT</u> dojo, as dojos can often be missed.

If your child's attendance has fallen below 95% you will receive a letter to communicate this. If attendance continues to drop further, you will be contacted for an attendance meeting to ensure we are working together to maximise your child's attendance.

This month's whole school attendance is 94.93% and our school target is 96%. This figure has improved since last month but we continue to strive for our target.

Well done to Year 6 who are our half termly winners! You have earned an extra playtime. Weekly attendance is celebrated in assembly and winning classes receive a trophy and extra MUGA time. The classes with highest attendance that week earn an extra play.

<u>Impact of lateness</u>

Over a school year : 5 minutes late every day = 3 days absent 15 minutes late every day = 10 days absent 30 minutes late every day = 19 days absent

Pupils arriving late miss valuable teaching and learning time and it can contribute to them becoming anxious in school.

Altendance and punctuality reminders

<u>Reporting absence</u>

Please contact the school office by 8.30 the first morning of each absence. If no reason is provided the absence will be unauthorised on the attendance register.

<u>Medical appointments</u>

We expect parents to make medical and dental appointments for their children before or after school or during the school holidays. If this is not possible, confirmation of the appointment will be required <u>prior</u> to authorising the absence. If no evidence is provided, the absence will be unauthorised.

Children are expected to attend school prior to the appointment and parents are expected to return their children to school following the appointment. If your child does not attend school before or after the appointment the absence will be unauthorised.

Holidays




